The school Principal, Mr Ajith Jacob, delivered the annual report,




SPARKS ENTHUSIASM AT ANNUAL ATHLETIC MEET



Fireflies in Science

Fireflies are mystifying to see – they're a dazzling light show of their own. Now, imagine a synchronized light show, with multiple fireflies. Amazed?

In Japanese folk traditions, these stunning insects symbolize departing souls. Some cultures in the Peruvian Andes view them as the eyes of ghosts. In many Western cultures, fireflies, glowworms, and other glowing insects are often related to many, sometimes contradicting, metaphors: childhood, doom, elves, fear, luck, mortality, solstice, stars, and even the fleetingness of words.

And, yet, why they glow has troubled scientists for quite some time. Finding the specific species of firefly themselves, Photinus carolinus, was quite the task in itself. There are over 2,200 known species of fireflies around the globe - with more being continually discovered - and only three have the unique ability to flash in synchronic-ity.

To understand synchronous fireflies, one needs to know what bioluminescence is. Fireflies produce light through a chemical reaction involving a molecule called luciferin. When luciferin reacts with oxygen, it produces light. This light is used by fireflies primarily for mating purposes, with each species having its unique pattern and timing. What makes the synchronous fireflies truly remarkable is their ability to synchronize their flashing patterns. During mating season, usually in late May to early June, male fireflies emit rhythmic flashes. These flashes are timed with remarkable precision. The synchronization process involves a form of mutual adaptation. Each firefly adjusts its flashing to align with the rhythm of its neighbours. This synchronization can be so accurate that entire groups of fireflies blink in unison, creating a stunning visual effect that is both scientifically intriguing and visually spectacular.

The reasoning behind this display of light are still not exactly known. However, researchers suggest that fireflies use a form of feedback loop. When one firefly flashes, it can influence the timing of nearby fireflies, leading to a chain reaction that brings them into sync. This form of communication is thought to be crucial for avoiding predators.

In experiments, scientists have found that fireflies can synchronize even in the absence of external cues, suggesting an ability to adjust their rhythms in response to others. This displays an interesting example of animal communication.


The fireflies offer a unique glimpse into the wonders of nature, blending fascinating science and unmatched beauty.



Corporal Punishment in India

There have been improvements in the education norms under the law over the last few years, but there's still a lot to be done in India concerning preventing corporal punishment of children. The education authorities and law enforcement agencies need to be more severe in enforcing such rules that prohibit corporal punishment for children should not feel threatened at the platform vital for their education and development.



The Evolution of Mental Health Talk

However, for the longest time, mental illnesses have been treated not as illnesses that need treatment, but as problems so severe that the people facing them must be ostracised or altogether eliminated. But where did this stigma begin?

In ancient times, the public believed that individuals with what we now term "mental illnesses" were possessed and that their issues could be solved only with magic with the help of amulets and charms. Those who attempted to treat mental disorders were associated with witchcraft and those with the ailments were termed 'insane' and isolated. After this development, people began to open 'mad-houses,' where those with mental disorders were kept for fear that they were harmful to society. They functioned as prisons and did not attempt to help nurse the patients back to health. However, the close of the eighteenth century brought about a change in attitude at least in Europe. 'Asylums' began to be established where patients could go to get better, replacing the mad-houses. It was the First World War which finally brought about a significant turning point in the public's understanding of mental health. Soldiers having suffered emo-

tional trauma on the frontlines received the diagnosis of "shell shock," a phrase derived from the explosive shells used during the war. Psychiatry was finally acknowledged as a science in the 1960s, which made patients viable for treatment in hospitals rather than sentences in mad-houses and asylums.

It is unfortunate that so many years after the war, mental health wellness is still such a stigmatised topic. The public's understanding of mental health has grown significantly, but the shame surrounding conversations about the topic has lessened only slightly. People still associate therapy with madness and insanity and speak about those with mental illnesses in a derogatory manner. The most disappointing part is that the stigma around mental illnesses started due to ignorance: people were not familiar with mental illnesses and so they were afraid. However, in recent years, even though we now know a lot more about the subject, there is still a taboo surrounding it. People still feel ashamed to talk about their feelings or to seek therapy even when they need it.

More than half of individuals around the world dealing with mental illnesses fail to avail treatment simply for fear of being treated differently in society. In India especially, mental health literacy is incredibly low. A study conducted by WHO revealed that 4 out of 5 people in low to middle-level income countries like India do not seek help even for debilitating mental disorders. It is estimated that by 2030, India will have the highest number of people with depression and anxiety worldwide. The stigma runs deep in most public institutions, with most people associating visible signs of mental illnesses with substance abuse instead of mental disorders.

Over the last few years, there has been a significant shift in the way that mental health is talked about, specifically on social media. While older generations continued to pretend that these problems do not exist, younger generations took to social media to spread awareness about mental health wellness. While this has helped to spread awareness across the globe, a new problem has arisen because of it: people on social media began to romanticise the idea of mental illness.

The talk of mental health and its association with artists and writers made it so that people now viewed being depressed or having anxiety as an essential part of what made you interesting. It was no longer a debilitating disease to be afraid of, but rather something that gave you character and personality. Tropes like 'the tortured artist' made having a mental illness or having trauma something to aspire to instead of a real, actual illness that people were dealing with on a day-to-day basis. It led to the extreme romanticisation of mental illness and a rise in the desire to be sad and to have trauma. It got to the point where people on social media even began to fake having mental illnesses to gain attention and sympathetic comments from other users.

People behave this way not only in front of the camera but also in their day-to-day lives. The desire to lead a tragic life runs incredibly deep. In his book, 'On the Genealogy of Morality,' Nietzsche describes what he calls "the internalising of man," stemming from his concept of guilt. He talks about how humans are inherently cruel beings and only slowly gained a concept of guilt and morals. Due to this, humanity began to experience internalisation: our inherent desire to be cruel is satisfied by being cruel to ourselves through self-sacrifice or self-denial. While this is an extreme take on the matter, there is some truth to it: humans do have an inherent desire to be sad, and it is only amplified when they see others getting attention and sympathy for it online.

This jump from the extreme stigmatisation of mental health talk to its romanticisation seems drastic. It cannot really be called a 'jump,' however, because both exist at the same time. There is still a lot of shame attached to conversations surrounding mental health in the real world, while in the

online space, it seems to have become something that every other individual wishes to gain traction using. These are the two extreme ends of the spectrum, and we must become conscious of how we talk about mental health in our daily lives so that the conversation surrounding it becomes fruitful. We must be aware, help those around us and ensure that we are not spreading either the stigma or the romanticisation of mental illnesses.





being, whether living or non-living. When Shakti, the divine feminine energy, unites with Shiva, life bursts forth, animating the particle or being.




A MEMORABLE JOURNEY: Agra, Fatehpur Sikri, Noida & Delhi


EXCURSION TO AMRITSAR & CHANDIGARH A JOURNEY OF HISTORY, CULTURE & SCIENCE
